Find your perfect seat with this quick guide before your next live show!

Get to Know the Venue First

- ☐ Review the seating chart
- ☐ Find stage and premium areas
- ☐ Watch for obstructed or limited views
- ☐ Note soundboard/lighting placements
- ☐ Consider elevated seating for better visuals
- ☐ Check for ADA options
- ☐ Always read seller notes

Use Filters to Save Time and Sanity

- ☐ Filter by price, section, quantity, ADA access
- ☐ Start with lower prices and adjust upward

Match Your Seat to the Event Type

- ☐ Concerts: Floor for energy, bowl for view
- ☐ Theater: Center orchestra or front mezzanine
- ☐ Comedy: Sit close for best experience
- ☐ Festivals/GA: Arrive early or get VIP

Price Isn't Everything

- ☐ Higher price doesn't always equal better experience
- ☐ Seek value: price + view + location

Understand What You're Buying

- ☐ GA = No assigned seat
- ☐ SRO = Standing Room Only
- ☐ Pit = GA near stage
- ☐ Lawn = Casual outdoor space
- ☐ GA seat numbers often for inventory tracking

Look for Buyer-Friendly Tools

- ☐ Mobile-friendly browsing
- ☐ Filters for easy sorting
- ☐ Clear seller notes

Know That Your Ticket Delivery May Vary

- ☐ Email Delivery
- ☐ Instant Download
- ☐ Mobile E-Tickets
- ☐ Shipped Tickets
- ☐ AXS Mobile ID
- ☐ Electronic Transfer
- ☐ Special Delivery (Local Pickup, Will Call, Paperless)
- ☐ Look for platforms that offer assurances and protection about timely ticket delivery

Know the Secondary Market

- ☐ Tickets resold by individual sellers or brokers
- ☐ Inventory moves fast and prices fluctuate with demand
